

Evening and weekend Transfer Academy

The evening and weekend Transfer Academy is designed for working students who wish to pursue a general education transfer degree or who wish to transfer to a four-year college or university.

The courses offered in the academy consist only of those courses that have been accepted in the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum. For more information refer to the college catalog. Students should also plan on meeting with a counselor to investigate the Evening and Weekend Transfer Academy, to be assessed, and to learn more about the Associate of Arts degree in General Education Transfer.

The academy offers courses in five-week blocks year-around so that a student may complete all IGETC (transfer) requirements in the academy. With such an opportunity, a student may finish the entire IGETC in the evening and weekend academy. A student may take up to two courses per five-week session.
